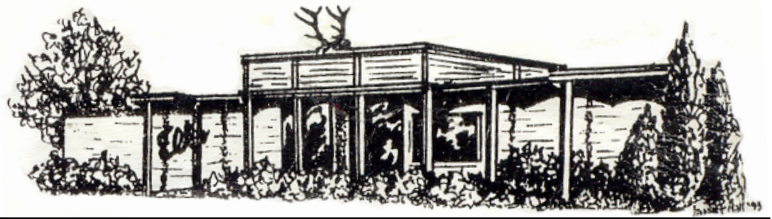

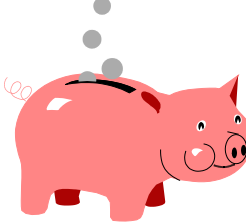

Hi, my name is Dakota. I'm five and I go to kindergarten this year. I like school and my teacher is really nice. When I was born I had a difficult delivery and so I have cortical blindness, some gross motor and fine motor challenges. This year I have started to talk a lot, so life is easier because I can tell people what I need. Last year I would get so frustrated that I would get really mad. But I don't do that so much anymore.

My therapist comes to my house every week. At first I worked a lot on feeding myself using my fingers, but now I can use a spoon and a straw, so I'm pretty independent. All this work on feeding and blowing has helped me with my speech. Talking has really changed my world and I am learning new words every day.

I like the activities my therapist brings each week. Right now, I like making peg designs, blowing a pinwheel, using both my hands to cut out toy cookies, and sorting by color and shape. We do lots of different things each week. I'm making really good progress thanks to all the support I get from my therapist and my family.

My family is grateful to the Elks Therapy Program because the therapist comes to the home and helps me with the activities that are important in our home life.

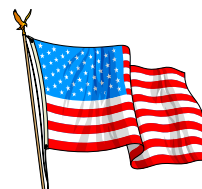
